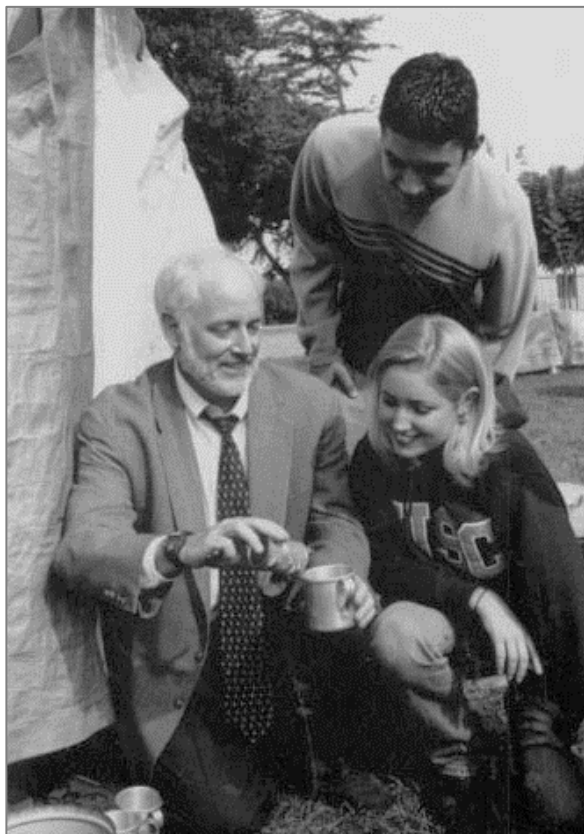

In addition to the new four-unit G.E. Seminars that meet general education requirements, the University has a program of two-unit Freshman Seminars that help entering students understand the bigger picture of academic life at USC. Freshman Seminars are elective classes open only to freshmen, led by professors invited to teach subjects they find especially intriguing or provocative. Participants earn two units on a credit/no credit basis. No prior knowledge of the subject matter is expected. Freshman Seminars are scheduled once a week, usually in the afternoons, Monday through Friday. Most meet for two hours at a time and run for ten or eleven weeks. Some include visits to laboratories, or other sites but all meet initially on the main campus and end before final exams.
